Fees (all marchers)

2024-25 Fees: \$600* (\$520 for each additional sibling)

Deposit of \$100 (non-refundable) at time of registration

Other Expenses

These anticipated expenses are for family budget planning purposes. Ordering instructions will follow.



- **All marchers must have a *wind suit*.** Returning marchers may wear last year's wind suit if it still fits and is in good condition.
 - **Wind suit jackets** for new marchers will be ordered during camp and run about \$40.
 - **Wind suit pants** are Adidas Tricot Three-stripe Track Pants (see photo), black with white stripes, no cuffs. Zip hem optional. **Marchers are responsible for purchasing these.** They run about \$30-40 from [Amazon \(click here for a link\)](#) or most department stores. ([Women's style here](#); same look, slimmer fit, no zipper on hem.)
- Home football game meals: \$6-\$12 per game if preordered. Students may also bring their own meals.
- All band members will also pay a **\$50 Concert Band Fee** and must purchase concert attire (again, last year's may be worn if in good condition). Students will receive more information in band class.
- **Water bottles:** each family is asked to provide at least **48 small (8 oz) disposable water bottles** to be used by the marchers at games and competitions. These can be dropped off during camp.

Wind players and percussion only:

- Marching shoes - \$40
- Gloves - \$5
- Long black athletic socks - \$5 (may be purchased on your own)

Color Guard only:

- Guard shoes - \$39
- Guard gloves - \$15
- Rifle (optional) - \$60ish
- Show makeup - varies

CAMP, PRACTICES, COMPETITIONS, & GAMES

Attendance Policy

Marching Band is a graded class, and attendance is taken at every practice and event. Non-emergency absences must be arranged in advance with approval from the director (at least two weeks' notice preferred). If a student must be absent, email attendance@bhsbands.org and include the student's name and the reason for the absence. ***Emails must come from the parent—no student emails will be accepted.***

Regular practices begin the first week of school and end in early November.

Home Game Schedule – Students will remain after school for rehearsal, followed by a break and dinner. Around 5:45pm, students will change into their uniforms and prepare for pregame activities. If you would like to see the band perform pregame, plan to arrive by 6:30pm to find a seat in the stadium.



Competitions

Competitions are a community experience for the Marching Bobcats and families. Getting the full band and all their instruments, uniforms, props, and equipment to an event takes many willing hands. The BSO will send out an itinerary before each weekend competition, along with sign-up information for chaperones and other volunteers. Students typically report in the morning for rehearsal and then eat lunch at school before traveling to the competition site. Once we arrive, volunteers help unload and prep equipment while students change into uniforms and warm up. After the band performs and all the uniforms, equipment, and instruments are packed away, students then get to relax and watch other bands perform. Band members are expected to remain at the venue through the presentation of awards and will travel back to Battlefield on buses and help unload equipment before being dismissed. Parents will be informed of estimated return times. The more volunteers we have, the sooner we all go home. And volunteers receive free admission! 😊

Family members who wish to attend the performance may travel to the competition site on their own. Admission is typically \$10-15 per person. Plan to arrive at least 45-60 minutes before the scheduled performance time as schedules are subject to change. Marchers are expected to return on the bus with the group unless arrangements are made in advance with the approval of the director.

The BSO will provide lunch for students and chaperones at all competitions. Students may wish to bring snacks or money to purchase concessions for dinner as competitions can run into the evening.

THE LOWDOWN



1. **Be on time.** Rehearsal starts at the posted time. Arrive at least 15 minutes early to find a place for your things, assemble your instrument, put on extra sunscreen, and use the bathroom. **At start time, be ready to march!**



2. Prepare for **heat.** Marchers should slather on sunscreen, wear a hat and sunglasses, and drink plenty of water. A water bottle filling station is available inside.



3. Wear **sturdy shoes** that are already broken in. **Cushioned socks** are recommended.



4. Marchers need to eat a **healthy breakfast** and **pack a nutritious lunch**. Students burn a lot of calories at Band Camp and need fuel to make it through the long days. Lunch is also a good time to socialize and get to know your fellow marchers.



5. Marchers are encouraged to dress for **Spirit Days** during Band Camp and at other times during the season. Section leaders will give more details. Each section has “color days” to show their section superiority by going all out in their section color. Dollar stores and thrift shops often have bandanas, hats, and beads to help you make your section proud!

Drumline – White

6. **Rest.** Put down the phone and turn in early during Band Camp weeks. Trust us on this one!



7. **Exercise now.** Your Marcher will enjoy Band Camp much more by being in shape before camp starts. Get outside and move this summer!



8. **Remember**—Camp is work time, but it is also FUN! Get to know your fellow Marching Bobcats and enjoy the time you have together. Parents are also encouraged to join us at the end of the practice day at the fence by the drill lot (AKA drivers ed lot) to meet other families and take a peek at the progress our marchers are making.

UNIFORMS



Uniform fittings will take place on **July 29-July 30** (first two days of band camp).

All wind players and percussion need to bring:

- Marching shoes (if you have them) to be checked for fit and condition
- Long athletic socks (to ensure proper fit for new marching shoes)

Each marcher will be assigned a uniform, which will be kept at school, and will be responsible for taking care of it during performances and returning it as directed after each use.

PERFORMANCE EXPECTATIONS

At every performance, Marching Bobcats are official representatives of our organization, our school, and our community, and should demonstrate high standards of appearance and behavior at all times.

Specifically:

- Band members must wear the official show t-shirt, black pants, leggings, or shorts, and long black socks under the uniform. Later in the season, students may wish to add thermal layers, which should also be black.
- Hair of sufficient length must be pulled up and tucked under the shako (hat).
- No hair dye or makeup may come in contact with the uniform collar or hat to avoid staining.
- Guard members will wear the official show uniform, or an alternate uniform as determined for events.
- NO JEWELRY of any kind, including watches.
- NO EATING OR DRINKING (except water) while in uniform.

At all-day events, students will be able to change out of their uniforms after performing and will then wear their wind suit. Wind suits may also be worn for performances in inclement weather.

Marchers are responsible for wearing the appropriate attire and bringing the correct shoes, socks, and gloves to every performance. If an item is forgotten, replacement socks and gloves must be purchased, and shoes must be rented (not all sizes available!). If these items are lost, damaged, or outgrown, the marcher must purchase replacements. Marchers must also take care of their uniforms, and any damage resulting from failing to follow these policies may result in the marcher being charged to repair the damage. Each uniform is valued at approximately \$450. ***Please help us keep our band looking amazing!***
